CSO WEEK 2023

About

CSO Week 2023 is the fifth in a series of annual events organized by a group of CSOs in Tanzania, led by FCS. The Week has grown into the biggest gathering of civil society actors in the country.

Theme: Tech x Society: Then, Now, and Beyond

In the rapidly evolving landscape of the 21st century, technology and society have become inextricably intertwined, significantly transforming the way we interact, communicate, work, and even perceive the world. This reality underscores the need for civil societies to adapt, innovate, and proactively navigate these changes to ensure their relevance and impact.

The proposed theme for CSO Week 2023, “Tech x Society: Then, Now, and Beyond,” captures this idea, highlighting the importance of understanding the progression of technology’s role within society and its implications for the civil society sector.

The “Then” component of the theme encourages civil society to examine the historical interplay between technology and society, offering insights into how past technological advancements have influenced societal structures, systems, and processes, including the work of civil society actors.

The “Now” component pushes civil society to critically analyze the current state of affairs, focusing on the contemporary impact of technology on societal dynamics and the opportunities and challenges it presents for CSOs in their efforts to effect change.

Lastly, the “Beyond” component prompts civil society to envision the future, recognizing that the intersection

of technology and society will continue to evolve. This compels civil society actors to anticipate and prepare for future technological trends and their potential societal impacts, ensuring that we remain at the forefront of these developments.

The choice of this theme also signals the organizers’ commitment to positioning CSOs at the center of the evolving tech debate, ensuring they are not left behind. The aim is to equip them with the necessary knowledge and tools to advise both government and private sector on opportunities and potential harms of technology to the country’s development. It also seeks to inspire CSOs to embrace the transformative power of technology, harnessing its potential in the interest of the communities they serve, while remaining cognizant of its potential dangers and harms.
